This course will build upon your existing skills, focusing on the Spanish grammar and how to construct sentences. You will develop writing, speaking, and listening skills through the study and practice of grammar, vocabular, and pronunciation.

What will I learn?

During the course the following topics will be covered:

- · Prepositions in general and of place
- · Recipes (imperatives)
- · Festivals and customs in Spain
- · Grammar points such as tener and ser, definite and indefinite articles, personal pronouns, masculine and feminine singular and plurals, and past and future tenses. You will also use reflexive verbs, adjectival phrases, and noun agreement. Comparisons, conjunctions, and connectives will also be covered.

Grammar will be covered for around 30 minutes each week and will require homework for consolidation purposes.
