What is the course about?

GCSE English is a fast-paced, fast-track resit GCSE English Language course for adults, to help you achieve the grade you need to succeed.

If you have not yet achieved your grade 4/C and above in English, then this course is FREE for you!

Applicants for this blended GCSE course will need to be confident with technology and fully committed. Students must attend at the scheduled times and have access to a device with a camera and microphone.

What will I learn?

This GCSE English course for adults is divided into two main areas of study, along with a spoken language endorsement:

Component 1: Non-Fiction Texts

Explore a variety of functional 19th-century non-fiction texts. You will:

- Develop skills to analyse and evaluate non-fiction extracts.
- Build transactional writing skills for different forms, purposes, and audiences.
- Use spelling, punctuation, and grammar accurately.

Component 2: Contemporary Texts

Study a range of 20th- and 21st-century prose fiction and literary non-fiction. You will:

- Learn to analyse and compare fiction and literary non-fiction extracts.
- Develop imaginative writing skills to engage your reader.
- Use spelling, punctuation, and grammar accurately.

The final assessment consists of two exams held nationwide at the end of the academic year, typically in May and June. Exam dates are fixed, so please ensure you are available to attend before enrolling.

Throughout the course, your tutor will continually assess your progress, providing individual feedback and tailored assignments aligned with exam requirements. The final GCSE qualification is awarded based on 100% exam performance.

What are the entry requirements?

Students whose first language is not English are advised to enrol on one of our ESOL courses first, then the Functional Skills course, before joining the GCSE course.

All applicants should have a very strong grasp of spoken, listening, and reading English. You should also be prepared to complete work outside the classroom.

Finally, all applicants will be required to complete an assessment to ensure they can meet the demands of the course.
