What is the course about?

This introductory part-time art and design course is designed especially for adults. You'll have the chance to explore a wide range of craft materials and experiment with various techniques across different areas such as drawing, painting, printing, sculpture, textiles, and photography.

Along the way, you'll learn about different artists and how they develop ideas based on themes they choose personally. This will inspire and guide you as you create your own unique artworks. Throughout the course, you will have opportunities to present your work and reflect on your creative journey.

Why should I choose the course?

If you have a passion for art and design and want to gain a formally recognised qualification, this course is the ideal choice. At Warrington & Vale Royal College, our well-established art department is part of the Advanced Creative & Digital Skills Academy, which connects students with strong employer links and real-world creative opportunities.

What will I learn?

- · Use drawing techniques with pencil, graphite, charcoal, and pastels

- Create 3D artwork using sculpture and textiles
- · Develop basic photographic techniques.

You'll also be introduced to a variety of historical and contemporary artists to help inspire and inform your own creative work.

Recent collaborations have included exciting projects with Culture Warrington, Warrington Museum, Lion Salt Works, and Blakemere Craft Centre.
