What is the course about?

If you would love to be on stage, or in front of a camera, this could be the course for you! This creative and expressive one-year course allows you to develop the practical skills and the underpinning knowledge required to be successful as an actor or musical theatre artist. Taking part in a variety of practical, structured, workshops, you will develop your performance skills across a range of genres and work collaboratively to rehearse and present at least four productions and showcases throughout the year.

Why should I choose the course?

Whether you dream of starring in the West End, or helping others realise their potential through teaching, this exciting course will provide you with the skills you need to secure employment in this fast-paced industry.

This energetic and exciting course is ideal for those who wish to become an actor, a musical theatre artist, or a performing arts teacher in community or educational settings. Previous students have gone on to run their own performing arts schools, teach performing arts in schools and colleges, or become actors on television, in theatre or on cruise ships. This course is ideal if you wish to further develop your creative, performance and technical skills in order to progress on to university or employment within the performing arts industry.

The course focuses on developing practical and performance skills rather than preparing you for an exam, and all theory will underpin the live projects and performances you are undertaking. Each successful applicant will become a member of the college's resident performing arts company 'Boom Ensemble', where students will learn the processes of being a member of a professional theatre company.

What will I learn?

This one-year, vocationally driven course will help you develop the fundamental skills to succeed in the dynamic entertainment industry. These include practical/performance skills, audition techniques, marketing materials, professional etiquette, communication skills, and performance collaboration approaches. You will also look at solo and ensemble performance techniques, characterisation processes, peer assessment and critique, text analysis and devising performances/productions of all sizes.

What will the course lead on to?

After successfully completing this course, you will have the skills and knowledge needed to progress on to employment or further education. You may wish to progress on to our Level 3 Acting and Musical Theatre course to enhance your knowledge and refine your performing skills.

Why should I choose to study the course at Warrington & Vale Royal College?

Throughout your course you will be taught by highly skilled staff with both acting and dance specialisms. What are the entry requirements?

Minimum of four GCSEs at grade 3 or above, including English and/or maths, or successful completion of a level 1 course.

If you have a GCSE grade 3 or lower in English and/or maths and wish to study at level 2, you will have to resit English and/or maths as part of your level 2 qualification.
