What is the course about?

This counselling course is ideal for students who wish to develop an understanding of counselling theory and a range of counselling skills.

What will I learn?

You will learn the basic elements of the person-centred approach as well as receiving an introduction to other modalities.

The course aims to develop your understanding of what counselling is and how it differs from other helping relationships. The course will help you to learn more about yourself and develop your listening skills when working with others.

This course requires you to work through two workbooks and complete written tasks. You could be studying using either physical workbooks or an online learning portal. Your tutors will explain this further at the beginning of the course.

What will the course lead on to?

Successful completion of this course will allow you to apply for the Level 3 Certificate in Counselling Studies here at Warrington & Vale Royal College.
