What is the course about?

If you love the spotlight and dream of seeing your name in lights, then contemporary and commercial dance could be the perfect course for you! This imaginative and expressive course will nurture your creativity, enhance your performance skills, and teach you about a whole host of performance genres, preparing you to move on to the Level 3 Contemporary & Commercial Dance qualification. You will be able to put your talents to the test in our incredible theatre and specialist dance studios, before taking to the stage and showing off your skills.

Why should I choose the course?

In this fast-paced creative industry you'll have the world at your feet! Whether you want to secure the starring role in the most popular West End show or want to help others realise their potential through teaching, you're sure to find a way to unleash your talent.

This energetic and exciting course is aimed at students who wish to pursue a career as a dancer, choreographer, or a dance teacher in community and educational settings. Previous students have gone on to run their own dance schools, teach dance in schools and colleges, or become dancers on television, in theatre or on cruise ships. This course is ideal if you wish to further develop your creative, performance and technical skills in order to progress on to university or employment within the performing arts industry.

The course focuses on developing practical and performance skills rather than preparing you for an exam, and all theory will underpin the live projects and performances you are undertaking. Each successful applicant will become a member of the college's resident dance company 'Company Boom', where students will learn the processes of being a member of a professional dance company.

What will I learn?

Learning and rehearsing in our newly-refurbished theatre and specialist dance studios, this creative one-year course allows you to develop the practical skills and the underpinning knowledge required to be successful as a dancer/dance artist. Taking part in a variety of practical, structured workshops, you will develop your dance skills across a variety of genres and work collaboratively to rehearse and present a wide range of performing arts productions throughout the year. Modules will focus on a range of commercial and contemporary dance styles, including classical, ballet, jazz, hip hop and more. You will also focus on peer assessment and critique, choreography and solo and ensemble performance.

The course is vocationally driven and will therefore not include exams. Assessment will take place through project-based work where the emphasis is on you developing your skills and performing.

After successfully completing this course, you will have the skills and knowledge needed to progress on to employment or further education. You may wish to continue your studies at Warrington & Vale Royal College to complete your Level 3 Diploma in Contemporary & Commercial Dance and take your skills to the next level.

What are the entry requirements?

p>Minimum of four GCSEs at grade 3 or above, including English and/or maths, or successful completion of a level 1 course. If you have a GCSE grade 3 or lower in English and/or maths and wish to study at level 2, you will have to resit English and/or maths as part of your level 2 qualification.

Are there any additional costs associated with the course?

Dance students are required to purchase their own costumes for shows and must wear black clothing for lessons (t-shirt, leggings/jogging bottoms, hoody, jumper).

You are also required to have appropriate dancewear including a black leotard/biketard, pink or black ballet shoes, pink or black tights, and black character shoes. You will also be required to provide your own basic equipment such as notebooks, folders, and pens.
