What is the course about?

An exciting and immersive two-year course that is suitable for anyone who is passionate about having a career in the performing arts industry. This creative course allows you to develop the practical skills and the underpinning knowledge required to be successful as an actor or musical theatre artist. Taking part in a variety of practical, structured workshops, you will develop your performance skills across a variety of genres and work collaboratively to rehearse and present a wide range of performing arts productions throughout the year.

Why should I choose the course?

Whether you would love to be on stage yourself or help others realise their potential through teaching, this exciting course will help you unleash your talent and propel you towards a rewarding career in this fast-paced industry.

This energetic course is ideal for those who wish to pursue a career as an actor, director, or drama teacher in community/educational settings. Previous students have gone on to run their own drama schools, teach in schools and colleges, or become actors on television, in theatre or on cruise ships. This course is ideal if you wish to further develop your creative, performance and technical skills in order to progress on to university or employment within the performing arts industry.

The course focuses on developing practical and performance skills rather than preparing you for an exam, and all theory will underpin the live projects and performances you are undertaking. Each successful applicant will become a member of the college's resident performing arts company 'Boom Ensemble', where students will learn the processes of being a member of a professional theatre company. Each year, you will take part in at least four performances at college.

What will I learn?

Throughout this course, you will further develop your creativity in acting, vocal and movement. It is vocationally driven and will help you develop the underpinning skills required for industry. These include practical/performance skills, audition techniques, marketing materials, professional etiquette, communication skills, and performance collaboration approaches. You will focus on a wide range of theatre genres, look at reflective critique and peer assessment, develop research techniques, and have the opportunity to take part in at least four performances per year.

You will also be given the opportunity to develop production skills in costume and set design, lighting and make-up.

What will the course lead on to?

After successfully completing this course, you will have the skills and knowledge needed to progress on to employment or further/ higher education. You may wish to enhance your skills further by progressing on to our HNC and HND courses, or

What are the entry requirements?

You will need a minimum of five GCSEs at grade 4 or above, including English and/or maths, or you will have need to have successfully completed the Level 2 Performing Arts course. If you have not already achieved a grade 4 in your either your GCSE English or maths, you will be required to work towards this as part of your study programme.
