LEVEL 3 DIPLOMA ADULT CARE

Subject Area Student Type Study Mode Health, Social Care & Life Sciences Adults Part Time

What is the course about?

This qualification is suited to those that work in the health and social care sector. You will develop your knowledge and understanding of the requirements of supervision and leadership within the sector.

You will begin to develop your knowledge, skills, behaviours and understanding of best working practices, team leading and may develop into a key worker or support worker role, allowing for greater autonomy and responsibility.

You will work with, not only your colleagues, but interact with a wide range of health care professionals including managers, District Nurses, GP's/Consultants, rehabilitation professionals, such as SALT, physiotherapists, occupational health, podiatrists and various members of a hospital care and discharge team, taking the lead with the care and rehabilitation planning. The learner will work as a lead member of a team, ensuring frontline staff are improving the quality of life of those they support.

Why should I choose the course?

This course is for those who are looking to further their career in health and social care and step into a senior role. You will achieve the Level 3 Diploma in Adult Care.

What will I learn?

Key topics include: Importance of handling information, legislation and supporting regulations, medication administration and ordering, returning, stock checks and the handling of controlled drugs, audits and continuous sector specific training including; dementia, acquired brain/spinal injury, supporting therapy services through rehabilitation plans, end of life, wound care and catheter care.

The qualification is mainly work-based learning; however, students will also attend 6 3-hour classes (these will be either face to face in college or delivered remotely), these cover the mandatory knowledge elements such as safeguarding, legislation and regulations surrounding medication administration, the Mental Capacity Act, duty of care, person centered approach, wellbeing, infection control, promoting choice & independence.

Monthly 2-hour 1:1 sessions will also take place in the workplace to complete, work-based observations, recorded professional discussions, retrospective observations and the assessment of workplace product evidence.

In addition, students will also meet with their college assessor remotely, usually on 3 occasions lasting approximately 30 minutes to review their progress.

Self-study of approximately 2 hours per week is also required.

Duration of the course is 12 months

What will the course lead on to?

Upon achievement, you may choose to continue your studies with a higher-level, for example Level 5 Diploma in Leadership and Management for Adult Care or an apprenticeship such as Lead Practitioner in Adult Care or Leader in Adult Care or apply to University.
