What is the course about?

The Preparation for Supported Employment is a programme of study that is specifically designed to help 17-23 year olds with an Education, Health and Care Plan to gain the skills and experience they need to succeed in the world of work. This course combines learning about employability, building English & maths skills and exciting work experience opportunities within the college. If you are a student with a real ambition to progress into paid or voluntary employment in the future, then this could be the perfect course for you.

Why should I choose the course?

Preparation for Supported Employment is for you if you have a learning disability or learning difficulty but have a real willingness to experience and learn more about work but perhaps are not quite ready for working directly with an external employer. Everything about the course is specially adapted to maximise your skills and abilities so that you can engage in the workplace and grow in confidence.

What will I learn?

Preparation for Supported Employment is the perfect stepping stone to a supported internship, as it combines work experience within the college, exploring different areas, as well as time in the classroom to gain skills in maths, English, and employability.

You will learn about the world of work including researching different careers, how to behave in the workplace, practical skills, communication skills, customer service and how to present yourself. You will gain confidence in your communication, independence and practical skills. You may have the opportunity to work in the Novel Bite Cafe and may also have the opportunity to participate in a range of work-related such as guest speakers, work place visits, social enterprise, job readiness and community group projects.

The overall aim is to increase your confidence and introduce you to different job roles and to equip you with the skills you need to progress in the workplace.

What will the course lead on to?

After the Pre-internship course has finished, it is hoped that you will progress on to the Supported Internship course where you will work with an external employer for up to four days per week and attend college just one day per week to maintain your maths, English and employability skills or join our exciting new project at Warrington Hospital to be a part of DFN Project Search Internship Programme.
